Youth Career Commission Inc. AI Career Readiness Boot Camp

Program Overview

YCCI is offering a free two-day AI Career Readiness Boot Camp, June 22 - 23, 2026, from 9:00 AM - 2:00 PM each day, at Statesboro High School located at 10 Coach Lee Hill Blvd, in Statesboro.

This program is designed to help high school students learn how to use Artificial Intelligence responsibly, safely, and productively. This training will introduce students to AI as a tool for learning, career preparation, creativity, entrepreneurship, technology, and responsible digital citizenship.

Our main message in this training is to Use AI to strengthen your thinking, not replace your thinking.

Students will be taught that AI is a helpful tool, but it should never replace honesty, hard work, personal responsibility, critical thinking, or good judgment.

Training Includes:

- Understand what AI is and what AI is not.
- Use AI responsibly for schoolwork without cheating.
- Fact-check AI responses and identify misinformation or bias.
- Protect personal information and avoid unsafe online behavior.
- Use AI for career exploration, resumes, interviews, and future planning.
- Use AI for creativity, media ideas, entrepreneurship, and problem-solving

YCCI's goal is to help young people become better thinkers, better creators, better problem-solvers, and better prepared leaders for the future.

Frequently Asked Questions:

1. What is the cost to attend this program?

Students may attend this program at no cost, but donations are accepted.

2. Will breakfast and lunch be provided?

Breakfast will not be provided, lunch and light snacks will be provided at no charge, but donations are accepted.

3. Is transportation provided to and from the school?

No, we will not provide transportation. We do encourage ride sharing as much as possible.

4. What should my child bring?

Students should bring a positive attitude, a willingness to learn, and any school-approved login information needed for computer lab access.

6. Will this training help my child with future careers?

Yes. Students will use AI to explore career pathways, identify needed skills, practice interview questions, draft professional communication, and think through future options such as college, trade school, military service, employment, entrepreneurship, and technology-related careers.

7. How many students are you accepting in the program?

Our current capacity is 12 students on a first come first in bases. There are no PA requirements.

8. What ages are allowed to attend this training?

This training is primarily for high school students, however, we will accept up to age 18 on a space available bases.

The overall goal of YCCI is to help young people become better thinkers, better creators, better problem solvers, and better prepared leaders for the future.
